CCSD93 Schools Closed Until At Least 4/6

Community Consolidated School District 93 will be closed for the next three weeks, beginning Monday, March 16. The earliest that schools would re-open is Monday, April 6, though closure may extend beyond April 6.

At this time, there are no reported cases of COVID-19 in any of CCSD93's schools. However, the district has decided to close out of an abundance of caution and in an effort to reduce the number of large gatherings in the community.

Monday, March 16 will be a non-attendance day with no assignments for students. As a result of today also being a planned non-attendance day, parents and students will have the opportunity to come into their school on Monday, March 16 during regular office hours to pick up learning resources, including textbooks, MacBooks, and any other necessary supplies. Students in grades 3-8 who have opted out of the MacBook take-home agreement will be allowed to take their devices home.

The district's goal is to begin providing remote learning opportunities on Tuesday, March 17. The district will be communicating how to access those plans through emails, at CCSD93's website (www.ccsd93.com), and social media channels. We understand that this learning will take many different forms based on family circumstances. We will be prepared to accommodate all situations.

March 30 through April 3 will be spring break with no assignments for students. At this time, we do not yet know how this closing will affect the date for the end of the school year. We will communicate that as soon as we have clarity from state and county officials.

The district will be posting updates and information at www.ccsd93.com/COVID19 as well as on the main webpage and social media sites.

Meals

The district expects to have meals available through March 27 for students who need food during the closure. More information will be shared via email, the district's website, and social media channels.

Learning at Home

While buildings are closed to students, Community Consolidated School District 93 believes that it is important for learning to continue as best it can. The district has not previously used a plan for remote learning, so adjustments may need to be made during the closure and communicated through email and at www.ccsd93.com.
